Minutes from the Borrowby Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 27th July 2017 at 8.00 pm in Borrowby Village Hall

1. Apologies

Apologies were received from C Cllr G Dadd. Cllr B Baker said he would try to attend later. Present: The Chairman (Cllr F Wachsberger), the Vice Chairman (Cllr D Craig), Cllr D Bell, Cllr E Town, Cllr J Dack, the Clerk, and nine members of the public.

2. <u>Minutes from Previous Meeting</u>

The minutes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 29th June, which were previously circulated, were agreed and signed.

3. Matters Arising

3.1 Cllr Bell met with County Cllr Dadd and a Highways officer at the Woundales to point out the broken fence. He said a bollard had been put there and Highways said funding would be available and it would be fixed. Cllr Bell said before meeting up with him C Cllr Dadd had attended a meeting in Knayton about the car parking problem on the road past the school.

4. Update from County and District Councillors if present

None were present.

5. Update from Borrowby Parish Councillors

<u>Cllr Dack</u> reported that he had attended the site meeting as Parish Council representative for the 5 houses application on Bedlam Hill. He said there were two officers from HDC, a representative from Highways and Mr Speight who also attended. He said it was a tightly controlled meeting. The new proposals are for a more undulating layout of buildings compared to the original proposal where they were designed in a line. The Highways Officer was satisfied with the site lines for the plans/entrance which had been slightly broadened and these would be adequate for wheeled bin collections. Cllr Dack had pointed out that the plans were outside the village limits. The proposed footpath was planned outside the hedge near the road. Cllr Dack said that it would be better to have the footpath on the inside of the hedge and linking up to the path on Back Lane. He said the hedge was not mentioned at the site meeting. The Chairman said when the amended plans a meeting may be arranged for the Parish Council and villagers to discuss. Cllr Bell said he had spoken to Andy about the hedge needing trimming and would speak to him again.

<u>Cllr Craig</u> said Mr & Mrs Reveley had asked if the trees could be trimmed on the lower Green. The trees had been trimmed 3 years ago so it was decided that Cllr Bell would ask for a quotation. Cllr Town pointed out that the chestnut tree was a bit lop-sided and overhanging the road so Cllr Bell will include this in the quotation.

<u>The Chairman</u> said during a few evenings with plays on at the school there were about 100 cars parked on the main road. He said we would see what Gareth found out at the car parking meeting.

Cllr Town had nothing further to add.
